FROM M5 SOUTHBOUND

Leave M5 at Junction 19 (Gordano Services). At end of the slip road, take the second exit off the roundabout (A369 to Bristol). Follow the A369 for 3.4 miles to traffic lights. Turn right onto B3129 (Beggar Bush Lane). Follow the B3129 for 2 miles to traffic lights at cross roads. Follow B3129 (Weston Road) straight over the crossroads. Continue down the hill for 1.4 miles to cross roads. Turn right at cross roads onto B3130

(Clevedon Road) toward Nailsea. Follow B3130 for 0.4 miles and entrance is on left hand side. Once in the vicinity of the showground, please follow the blue directional road signs

The Agility Challenge 2020 Rules



An Agility competition for large dogs Grades 1 - 4 jumping 600mm held using Kennel Club Ltd Rules & Regulations. There will be qualifying heats (5 partnerships per qualifier) who are invited to compete at

The Agility Challenge Grand Final to be held on Sunday 27 September 2020 at The Malvern Autumn Show, Three Counties Showground, Malvern WR13 6NW.

- 1. Once a dog has qualified (i.e. 5 finalists per heat) this eliminates the dog from taking a further finalist place at the heat and the next highest placed dog(s) in The Agility Challenge class will be invited to the final.
- 2. Handlers may not qualify more than one dog for The Agility Challenge final.
- 3. Any surrogate handlers must be notified in writing within 4 days of the last heat. NO amendments after this date and non-advice will disqualify the partnership.
- 4. Enquiries relating to each heat should be addressed to the organising club.
- 5. Enquires relating to The Agility Challenge Final should be addressed to The Agility Challenge, 2 Medley Grove Learnington Spa CV31 2GA.

PRIZES

Rosettes will be given to at least 10% of the entry in all classes. Trophies will be for 1st place in all classes and for all grades within graded classes. Additional trophies will be presented subject to the size of entry within each class.

Unplaced clear round rosettes in all classes collectable ON THE DAY only

Place rosettes are only collectable after the show if an SAE is sent to the Show Secretary

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. Special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure.

A class may be either held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression.

Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.

Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade. Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and point's progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

- Grade 1 Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.
- Grade 2 Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.
- Grade 3 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.
- Grade 4 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7
- Grade 5 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7
- Grade 6 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.
- Grade 7 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Any Size Jumping and Steeplechase Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes at this Show (Any Size classes excepted). Jumps heights will be set at 300mm for Large and Intermediate dogs and 200mm for Small and Medium dogs. This class will not include a set of weaves or a tyre. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's applicable jump height with one set of awards. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel club shows.

Grade Changes

If you entered the show online at Agility Plaza and the show has not yet closed then please change your grade on Agility Plaza.

If the show has closed for entries or you sent a postal entry, please advise Agility Plaza at support@agilityplaza.com at least 14 days before the show.



The Agility Plaza e-gility system will be in use at the show meaning that competitors can stay in touch with the situation at the rings via the Agility Plaza website

SHOW REGULATIONS

- Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
- 2) All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 3) Entry fee is £3.50 for all classes. Minimum entry fee payment for each dog is \pounds 7.00.
- 4) Prize money is not available for any classes.
- 5) Internet entries will be accepted via Agility Plaza.
- 6) The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 7) Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
- 8) A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
- 9) No classes will be capped at this Show
- Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 11) No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 12) The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competitions is forbidden.
- 13) No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 14) Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
- 15) Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 16) No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 17) Class 4 is sponsored by Country Shows Agility.
- 18) Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
- 19) The height of the hurdles in the Special Any Size Jumping and Steeplechase will be:
 - a) 300mm for Large and Intermediate Dogs,
 - b) 200mm for Medium and Small Dogs
 - c) Width: 1.219m (4ft) minimum.
- 20) The height limit for dogs.

- a) Large Dog classes For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - Intermediate Dog classes For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
 - Medium Dog classes For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
- Small Dog classes For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers (include only if applicable).
- 21) Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 22) Removal of dogs from Competition: Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:
 - a) A bitch which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
 - f) The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
- 23) Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
- 24) In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 8th April 2020 shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 25) Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 26) In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
- 27) Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand or while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
- 28) Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
- 29) Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
- 30) All competitors will be provided with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of a dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued. Junior competitors will be provided with an extra entry ticket for a Guardian.
- 31) Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
- 32) It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 33) <u>Animals in Event</u> No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 34) A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
- 35) There is insufficient space at this show for a practice ring.
- 36) Welfare of Dogs
- 37) An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
- 38) Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of and must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian
- 39) Your attention is drawn to Kennel Club rule F8(A) regarding dog fouling. "Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including the car and caravan parks and the show approaches".
- 40) Any bank charges resulting from cheques for entry fees being returned by the bank, will be the responsibility of the competitor concerned.

The one-day North Somerset Agricultural Show comprises classes for cattle, sheep, pigs, llamas and horses, and the Dog Agility Show will be held within the showground. There is plenty to see and do around the show, from tractor pulling to terrier racing and sheep shearing. From rural crafts to vintage tractors, live iron working to shopping amongst the trade stands and food hall - there is something to suit everyone.

The Agricultural Show does include some gun events and there are frequent loud bangs during the course of the day. Competitors should be aware of this when they enter the show.

EACH COMPETITOR WILL BE SENT, ALONG WITH THEIR RUNNING ORDERS, ONE NORTH SOMERSET SHOW ENTRY PASS FOR EACH SPECIFIED DOG HANDLER, ONLY SPECIFIED DOG HANDLERS WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE SENT A PASS INTO THE SHOWGROUND. WHERE MULTIPLE HANDLERS HAVE BEEN SPECIFIED FOR A SINGLE DOG, ONLY ONE ENTRY PASS WILL BE ISSUED.

IN THE CASE OF A JUNIOR HANDLER (under 18) ONE ADDITIONAL TICKET WILL BE SENT FOR AN ACCOMPANYING ADULT.

Additional exhibitor tickets are available for friends and family at the reduced rate of Adult: £9.00 Child: £5.00, Family: (2 adults and up to 2 children) £35, only when booked and paid for on this entry form. This compares very favourably with advance tickets, which are £15.00 for an adult, £5 child, £40 family, and Show day price of £18.00 for an adult, £8.00 for a child and £45 for a family. Please indicate on the entry form, the number of extra tickets required. If further tickets are required at a later date please call the Show box office on 01934 837285 to purchase tickets at the advance ticket price. Also one car park pass to the Forward Car Park will be sent with each application. This is a public car park and Severnside D.A.C. cannot accept any responsibility for losses in the car park. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused. Officials will be patrolling the car park during the show.

DOG SAFETY IN HOT CARS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- 1. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- 2. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- 3. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- 4. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- 5. At the show, your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in high temperatures.
- 6. Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- 7. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- 8. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Warning: if your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
